## **Compassion in Action Exhibit Highlights SCI**

A new exhibit at the Independence Seaport Museum, *Compassion In Action*, offers an inside look at the day-to-day life of men and women seafarers who visit the Philadelphia and South Jersey Ports along the Delaware River through the lens of SCI. Using videos, historical images and artifacts, original paintings by Carole Goddard, along with a variety of everyday items that resonate with individual seafarers, the exhibit uses stories to show how SCI has adapted over the years to best help the seafarers' changing needs – especially with the evolution of new technologies and security.



"We are excited for the opportunity to tell the story of our work through this community exhibit space," says Helene Pierson, Executive Director of Seamen's Church Institute. "We have been quietly serving the seafarers of the region in Philadelphia and South Jersey for three centuries, and are thankful to be able to share our work with the broader regional community."



Compassion in Action opened to the public on October 21, 2016 and will be available at the Independence Seaport Museum through March 12, 2017.
