### Volunteer Profile: Al Griffiths, ship visitor/host transporter



#### Tell us how you first got involved with SCI . . .

I became involved through David Reid, who at one time was the CEO of Novlog in Fairless Hills Pa, and I worked for him in the Traffic Department. Subsequently my career took me to Port Contractors, also in Fairless Hills, where I happened to meet David while he was performing a ship visit. We discussed his increased involvement with SCI and David asked if I would be interested in volunteering when I retired. Given the level of respect I have for David and the crucial mission of SCI I agreed to volunteer.

What do you most enjoy about ship visiting?

I had in the past always had a business relationship with the vessels. As part of terminal operations we were focused on our needs with regard to ship activity. Interaction with the ships was more businesslike and at times contentious. As a volunteer with SCI I see a different side of the crew, which is more open and friendly. Also volunteering has given me more access to the crew and not just the ships officers. If you want to see how people of different faiths, countries and backgrounds can live in harmony, visit a ship.

• Can you tell us about a ship visit that has really impacted you?

I recently visited a car vessel that was discharging and had an encounter with the crew that was memorable. On a table located in the crew quarters there were several jars and bowls that contained coins from places they had visited. There were US coins, Euros and Australian dollars. The crew had collected these coins and asked if I would accept them as a donation. It was very heartening to see the generosity displayed by this crew, and I will always remember it.

What do you wish other people knew about SCI?

The reward is far greater for the person volunteering than those who are served.

• What do you do when you aren't working or volunteering?

When I'm not working or volunteering I spend most of my time with family. I have three grandchildren who are a big part of my life.
